The February Weekend in Waverly was awesome! Twenty couples and 1 priest grew more deeply in love with their spouse. They worked hard on their relationships, and have joined all the rest of us on our journey. Please continue to invite for the June 2-4 weekend in Dubuque and October 13-15 Weekend in Cedar Rapids. Our Lord is counting on all of us to be His eyes, ears, hands, and mouth. We are His missionaries of today. So think of those couples, priests, and religious you want to invite to the weekend, and give them a gift they will thank you for, for the rest of their life.

Above is our Worldwide Marriage Encounter’s Vision and Mission Statement. Our mission statement says we are a movement of the people of God that dedicates itself to assisting all couples to live a joy filled and happy marriage. We do this by providing the Catholic Weekend Experience and by providing a support community for dialogue and growth. In other words we are a movement that has three primary goals: To spread the weekend by having more weekends, to give the best weekends possible, and to have better follow up after a couple/priest/religious makes a weekend. This is the direction of the movement. Our vision is to change the world around us. It is the same vision Christ proclaimed. Recently we attended a meeting with other Inviting Coordinators from Section 7. We discussed many ways to invite – some tried and true inviting ideas and some new ones.

Some ideas that were shared:

Dear Lovers,

The Section 6/7 2006 Convention in Collinsville Illinois July 21-23, 2006 is moving into final preparations and the convention team has a wonderful program planned for you. The theme of this convention is "Be the Light" and the convention outline committee has prepared presentation outlines around the key messages of being the light for your FAMILY, COMMUNITY, CHURCH, and WORLD. We are inviting all Marriage Encounter couples, priests and religious to participate in the convention by **sharing their stories about how couples, priests and religious that have been the light for you**. You should share this story with them whether we use your story or not in the convention talks because: they need to hear this from you; they need to be aware that their story might be selected to be included in one of the talks. So please copy them on the email to us.

Below is an example of (fictitious) stories that capture the tone and length of what we are looking for. Please think of the people in your Marriage Encounter family that have been the light in one of these areas and write up a paragraph about them.

You will notice that each one starts out with their names and the area that they have been the light. Each is about 45-75 seconds long. We would like to add 1-3 of these stories to each convention talk on Saturday. Please offer up your stories of the special ME people in your life and why they were the light for you and others. Please include a digital picture of the people involved or an "action photograph" of the place where your story occurs if available (example: if your story involved an ME couple that was the light at a nursing home, you might include a picture of them serving meals or sitting in front of the building talking with residents). If you have regular prints only, we can try to scan them and use them and we will try to return these photos if you tell us where to send them back to.

Please take 5 or 10 minutes and write us a story about a couple, priest or religious being the light. If you do not have a picture right now, that is fine, but please send the stories by **April 4th** so we have a good selection to choose from. We hope you are planning on attending the convention this summer but even if you are not, we want your stories! Here are samples of how long and what tone these stories should be:

Family

Ed and Mary are a light for their family. Ed and Mary go to great lengths to make each child feel special in their own way. They plan special outings with their kids and try to have a family meal together several times a week despite the hectic schedule they have. Their kids know that their friends are always welcome at their home even though even when the activities and sports contests fill up the schedule. It is not unusual for 2 or 3 extra kids to join in a weekend lunch or family meal. Ed and Mary offer their hospitality to their extended family as well and often host family get-togethers and celebrations like birthdays and graduations. They are openly romantic with each other in their home and "on the road" and they let their children, family and their friends see the love and passion they have for each other. They have been the light in helping their children see the value of marriage and a good marriage relationship.

Community

Ellen and Tom are a light for their Community. Ellen and Tom are always gentle and compassionate with each other but at the same time they exhibit a playfulness that we all admire and want for ourselves. They have been involved in our Community for over 12 years and have extended that involvement in the way they help support Weekends by being a prayer couple, writing letters, etc. They also have served as our prayer couple coordinator for several years, ensuring our community is supporting the weekend. They encourage other couples to do the same. Ellen and Tom weren't afraid to speak up and challenge our Community to be more when at a recent community picnic, several members suggested that we not dialogue and just enjoy the fantastic day. Tom and Ellen both spoke up and reminded everyone who we were and why dialogue is so important to each couple and religious, but to the health of our community. The sharing we had after that dialogue was one of the best our community has ever experienced even though the kids had an extended period of time to go crazy while we sat around the campfire and shared.

Church

Julio and Rosalinda Lopez are being a light in our Church. They had their marriage blessed by the Church after Julio was granted US Citizenship in 1999. They made their Marriage Encounter weekend 4 months later. On Sunday of their weekend, they heard the call to take the love they had for each other and give it away. They were surprised that their parish did not have a marriage prep program for Hispanic couples and most Spanish speaking couples seeking marriage had to go through the English version of marriage prep. They asked their pastor if they could help and he was very enthusiastic. Their pastor asked the Lopez's to participate in the diocesan training session and they learned that the diocese did not have the marriage prep materials translated into Spanish. While they were going through the training, they also began translating the materials into Spanish and asked the diocese to fund the printing of these new materials. The diocese agreed but asked Julio and Rosalinda to become part of their marriage prep team for Hispanics. Not only did they become a mentor couple in their parish for marriage prep, they assisted the diocese in training other Hispanic couples in marriage prep so that all Hispanic couples could have access to the same resources that the English speaking couples received.

World

David and Carrie are a light for our World and all of us that are blessed to know them. They made their marriage encounter weekend in the 70's and they heard the call to be open and apostolic. They dared to dream about their world as a place where they could make a difference. They heard the call that volunteers were needed to assist an Indian tribe in Wisconsin and took their two young sons and moved to the reservation one summer to volunteer their time talent and treasure. Carrie taught reading and geography during "summer school" and David assisted the tribal leaders in reconstruction of several community buildings and helped bring indoor plumbing to the community center making it possible to expand its use for larger events, tribal rituals, plays and musicals. They spent the most of two summers there and were made honorary members of the tribe for their missionary work. David and Carrie were a real light to the world because of their weekend and a desire to take their love and give it away.
